# Reading

Children will take home a book every Friday to share at home. Enjoy sharing the book together, look at the front cover, what is the title? who is the author? As you share the book, encourage your child to turn the pages and talk together about what you can see and what is happening using the pictures as prompts. Reading and sharing books will help towards your child's learning and development, as well as building foundations for later reading and writing. Please return the book by the following Wednesday.

During the year we will also be looking at books written by Eric Carle, this is our class name. He has written some lovely books such as The Very Hungry Caterpillar. If you would like to listen to his stories at home you can find these on YouTube.

## Home tasks

## **Knowledge Organiser and Literacy Focus**

Each half term children will bring home a knowledge organiser and literacy focus sheet. The literacy focus sheet contain information about the books we are reading we are covering in class and we ask that you also read and discuss these books with your children at home. The knowledge organiser lets you know the key vocabulary we are using linked to our topic and we ask that you use this language with your children at home too, they also contain links to videos, books and poems that support the topics we are covering.

### Talk Talk task

Children will receive a 'talk talk' sheet every half term. This will consist of a weekly question that you can discuss as a family. Please write down anything your child says and bring it back into school once completed so we can enjoy a lovely circle time together sharing our thoughts and ideas.

# Home Learning booklet

Children will receive a home learning booklet which provides information about what will be covered in each area of learning for that half term. There are also ideas to do at home based on our topic and links to websites that are useful to practice different skills such as number, counting, phase1 phonics.

#### **Early Years Curriculum Intent Statement:**

At Linacre Primary we view the Early Years as a basis for all future learning. We seek to develop each child's potential through a broad and balanced curriculum in a secure, caring and creative environment. In Nursery and Reception classes, our Early Years Curriculum is based on the revised Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum and is planned to lead smoothly into the National Curriculum at KS1 in a way in which is relevant and meaningful to all children. All children learn through play with a combination of child-initiated and teacher-led learning opportunities both indoors and in our outdoor area.

## There are seven areas of learning - 3 Prime areas and 4 Specific areas:

#### Three Prime areas of learning:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development Communication and Language Physical Development

#### Four Specific areas of learning:

Literacy
Mathematics
Understanding the World
Expressive Art and Design

For each area of learning there is a set of developmental stages and early learning outcomes which describe what each child is expected to be learning at each stage. Children are observed during play in order to assess their stage of development and in order to plan for the next steps in their learning.
