

### Spring 2

First half of spring term has seen Year 6 working extremely hard and overcoming challenges every day. As I'm sure you are aware by now SATs boosters have begun and children's attitude to both maths and English has been amazing. Children are getting stuck in and really appreciating all the support that they are receiving.

Over the next few works we will move closer and closer towards SATs and I hope Year 6 will continue to challenge themselves in all areas and be open to all learning.

<u>Reading</u>—It is vitally important that you still read with your child as much as possible. Once you have finished reading with them, ask them different questions where some they can find the answer in the text and other answers where they need to think for themselves.

<u>Spelling</u>—We use the RWI KS2 scheme for spelling. Your child will learn different spelling patterns each week.

<u>Writing</u>— At Linacre, we follow the National Curriculum for English using the Jane Considine scheme. This half term we are looking at writing an activist speech based on a popular speech by Greta Thunberg called 'Our House is on Fire'. Our focus will be reaching out to an audience to make a difference.

<u>Mathematics</u>—We follow the National Curriculum for Mathematics using the White Rose Mathematics scheme. This half term we will focus on percentages, algebra, converting units and finding the area, perimeter and volume of different shapes.

<u>Science</u>—Animals including humans: The heart and health. Children will find out about the function of blood and blood vessels, describe how the heart moves blood around the body, what affects heart rate and the consequences of an unhealthy lifestyle. They will also explore food groups and identify ways to eat a balanced diet.

Geography—This half term children will study globalisation.

<u>DT</u>—Children will be evaluating current mechanisms, designing and creating their own mechanisms to be used on a toy.

<u>Physical Education</u>—This half term we will be focussing on cricket. The children will develop skills, learn tactics, build teamwork and apply rules within a game.

<u>Music</u>— Listen and enjoy 'You've Got a Friend' music from the Charanga music scheme.

<u>Spanish</u>— The children will start to learn and speak in phrases to use in conversations taught by Mrs Seddon.

<u>Religious Education</u>— We follow the Sefton syllabus for RE and will continue to focus on Christianity and Islam this half term, following our trip to the Central Liverpool Mosque.

<u>PSHE</u>— Following our new scheme, children will focus on how to deal with conflicting emotions and mental health. This allows the children to have opportunities to discuss their thoughts and feelings and complete activities surrounding these topics.
